Dyslexia Teacher – Part Time Contracted

Primary Purpose: To instruct identified Dyslexic students in individual or small group arrangements for the purpose of remediation of reading to achieve grade-level performance.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree from accredited college or university
 - Training in Multisensory Teaching Approach program
 - Master's degree with Reading Specialist certification preferred
 - Academic Language Therapist certification preferred
- Major Responsibilities and Duties:**
- Assess students formally and informally for the purpose of planning instructional activities and providing feedback to students, parents and administration regarding students' progress, expectations, and goals.
 - Implement an instructional, therapeutic, or skill development program for assigned students and maintain ongoing documentation of student progress.
 - Plan and use appropriate instructional and learning strategies, activities, materials, and equipment that reflect understanding of the learning styles and needs of students assigned.
 - Work cooperatively with classroom teachers to modify regular curricula as needed.
 - Collaborate with teachers regarding best practice reading strategies for dyslexic students.
 - Advise parents and/or legal guardians of student progress for the purpose of supporting teacher's expectations, developing methods for improvement and/or reinforcing classroom goals in the home environment.
 - Report incidents for the purpose of maintaining personal safety of students, providing a positive learning environment and adhering to Education Code, district and/or school policies.
 - Maintain a professional relationship with colleagues, students, parents, and community members.
